Church (via Main Entrance)

Bilston Road Engine Shed by Robert & Roger Webb 4mm OO gauge

The layout represents a typical sub-shed in the industrial Midlands on the Western Region of British Railways, with locomotives return for overnight servicing and simple running repairs. Locos from other regions pay a visit from time to time.

Master Brewery 2mm N gauge

The layout shows a compact industrial scene and is somewhere to the west of London. The railway is set on two levels and includes a suburban station and large brewery complex.

Zweinuk 3.5mm HO gauge

This layout shows a European freight yard serving a variety of customers, including the army.

Track maintenance machines and infrastructure work trains will make occasional appearances, along with other machines for testing/route learning etc.

Marshleigh Wagon Repair Depot 4mm OO gauge

This layout shows a site in a fictional Wiltshire town where rolling stock from nearby engineering yards comes to be maintained. Slow shunting operations can be seen taking place, moving rusty wagons around

The End Of The Line 7mm O gauge

This layout represents the distribution point of a very small coal mining operation in the early 1960's. Never very busy, the output of the mine is divided between distant industry, transported away by rail and local demand which is handled by road haulage. The coal from the mine is delivered to the distribution point by a 2ft narrow gauge railway. The excellent KBscale tipper wagons have been made to operate and discharge their load into either a conveyor or direct into a waiting standard gauge mineral wagon.

The Coal Yard 4mm OO gauge

This layout is a working representation of the coal loading facility of a small colliery situated in a South Wales Valley.

Ashwood Basin 7mm O gauge

Ashwood Basin was part of the Earl of Dudley's railway system in the Black Country. It was used for the transhipment of coal to

the barges on the Staffs and Worc's canal, opened in 1829 to Shutt End, traffic lasting until the mid 50's.

Ashbrook by John Thomas 3mm TT gauge

This layout shows a fictional part of the M&SWJ in the 1950s, and has trains from the Midland and Southern regions, as well as from the Western region.

Barnwood Halt by Barnwood Model Railway Club 4mm OO gauge

This layout aims to allow the younger audience members to drive a selection of 0-4-0 driven passenger and freight stock.
